

Letter from A.P. Watt to S.R. Crockett

May 2nd 1911

Dear Crockett

I have just received from Messrs Smith Elder and Co and have pleasure in handing you here with the usual statements of account showing the sales of your books in their hands to the 31st of December last. There is as you will note a balance in your favour of 28 pounds 4 shillings and one pence and I have to day sent to your bank our cheque for that amount less commission as per the usual note of account herewith.

May I ask you when you have examined the enclosed statements kindly to return them in order that I may as usual file them here for future reference.

In their letter to me Messrs Smith Elder & Co write:

we are rendering on account of the six shilling editions of Mr Crockett's works to the 31st of December and we propose if you approve in future to make the account annually to the 31st of December in. instead of half yearly to the 31st of March and the 30th of September.

Presuming you would wish me to do so I have agreed to this proposal.
