

Letter from A.P. Watt to Percy Clark
London

November 20th 1903.

Referring to yours of the 11th I now take pleasure in returning to you herewith the revised copies of the agreements between your firm and Mr C. on the two works which he is to write for you. I think you will find all the clauses in both agreements to be correct and in order and if so I shall be glad if you will kindly initial sign and return all four to me when I shall at once send the duplicates on to Mr C for his signature prior to placing them in your hands.

I note what you say regarding a possible variation of the times at which the serials are to commence and while we shall at all times be glad to do all that is possible to meet your views either in this or on any other point I am afraid that there is not much opportunity for altering the dates provided for in the agreements. As I think I explained when I last had the pleasure of seeing you the dates in these agreements have been fixed in Mr C's other arrangements before us and are intended to give you as free a field as possible for the use of the stories which you have kindly agreed to buy
